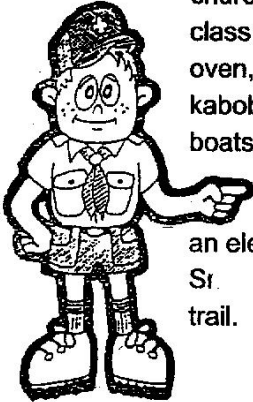




Troop 16 News

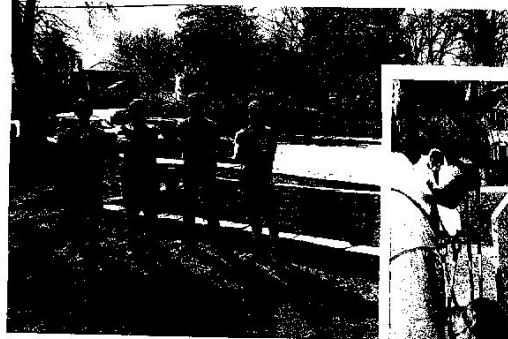
At meetings Mr. Flannery made a fingerprinting history presentation. We also had elections for the Order of the Arrow. We also did physical skill testing and knots.
